

The ball must be touched by another player.





U09/U10 Buildout Line




The Buildout line is a dividing line located between the goal line and the midfield line. It serves teach teams how to build out of the back.

U09/U10 Buildout Line



1. The Keeper can Distribute the ball, by hand, to any players behind the buildout line without pressure until the ball is touched by the player.


U09/U10 Buildout Line



The Keeper may place the ball on the ground for a kick.


The ball is LIVE once the Keeper places the ball on the ground and removes their hands.

U09/U10 Buildout Line




When distributed by hand, the ball is not live until it is either touched by another player on the same team or crosses the Buildout line.

U09/U10 Buildout Line




There are many ways to move the ball down field quickly but please remember the purpose of the buildout line.




Keep any plays simple to begin with.

Players must retreat once the Goalkeeper handles the ball or a Goal Kick is awarded.

Rules of Play

Borrowing Players

Can only borrow players if:

Needed to get to minimum players

Borrowing coach declares he borrow

Is approved by the opposing coach

Not intended to build an advantage

Must be same age group or one lower

Must be a registered player in the Recreation season

Must be registered with the league (insured)

Cannot be used during end of season tournament

This is not a recruiting tool

Basically, do not do this unless you absolutely need to.

SAFETY

Player safety comes first.

All our volunteers that directly interact with the kids like coaches and team managers need to have a valid Livescan on record.

Coaches are also required to complete the Safesport program.

All of this will get added to your admin record at CalSouth, be sure to use the same email address when completing each requirement.

SAFETY - REDUCING RISK

- ▶ Players cannot be left unattended at field.
- ▶ Set a tone of respect for players, parents, other coaches, administrators and volunteers.
- As an adult, never be alone with a player. If you are working with an individual player one-on-one, work in sight of other adults.
- ▶ Don't send players to restrooms alone, team managers make excellent for chaperons.
- Keep barriers in place. If communication occurs by text or emails, send group messages to the entire team, including parents.
 - Don't use these means to communicate on an individual basis.
- ► Limit the use of adult-to-player communication through cell phones.
- Adults involved in a team, club, league or association should not become "friends" with players on social web sites.

SAFETY - REDUCING RISK

- ▶ Coaches coaching players of the opposite sex should make sure to have an assistant coach, parent or manager of the same sex as the players at all practices, training sessions, games, etc.
- ► Have another adult at all practices. Be sure at least two adults wait for players to be picked up from practices and games; if there is only one adult available, such as the coach, then make sure the adult stays out in the open and visible.
- Establish boundaries between team and social activities.
- Watch for red flags:
 - Adults who seeks personal intimacy with a player or discloses intimate, personal or emotional feelings for a player.
 - Adults who "court" a player or responds in kind to flirting or seductive behavior.
 - Adults who make excessive or disproportionate physical contact with one player

PRACTICES

Age Appropriate

- Set reasonable practice times
- ▶ Teach the appropriate skills for their age group

Leave no player behind

- ► Engage players physically and mentally
- Don't leave a player at the field after practice

Inform Parents

- Good Communication means good participation
- Parents are the ones bringing them to practices

Leave no trash behind

Walnut Grove Park North

Monday thru Friday from 4pm till sunset

Walnut Grove Park South

Monday, Wednesday & Friday 4pm till sunset

Cerro de Las Posas Park (upper field)

► Tuesday & Thursday 4pm till sunset

Be sure you leave time to exit the field in time.

Walnut Grove North

Try to set up so that younger players are not next to older players.

We do not want wild shots to strike a younger player.

Set up to give the most teams space



GAME DAY

Be sure to arrive early.

make sure the team is present and warmed up

If you have the first match of the day, help set up

If you have the last match of the day, help with nets

Clean up after your match

Make room for the next match

Parking

Park in designated areas only

DO NOT park in the horse area

Space is limited, give yourself time in case you have to park further way.
